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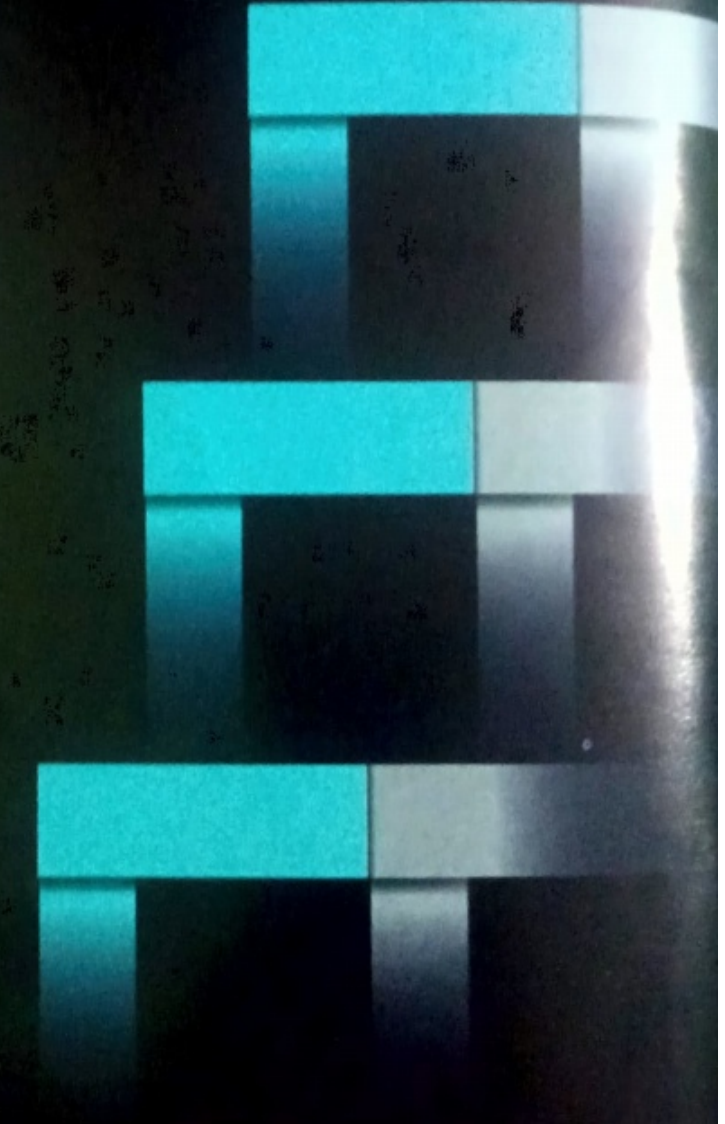


May we continue to give our students strong roots like the Banyan Tree and stronger wings to conquer the world.

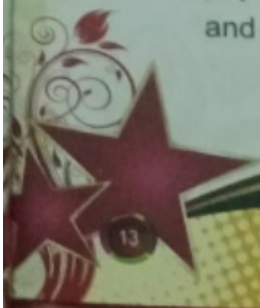
### Events and Activities

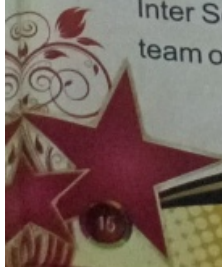

On the 14th of May, 2016, the school celebrated the World Astronomy Day with a lot of enthusiasm and fervour.

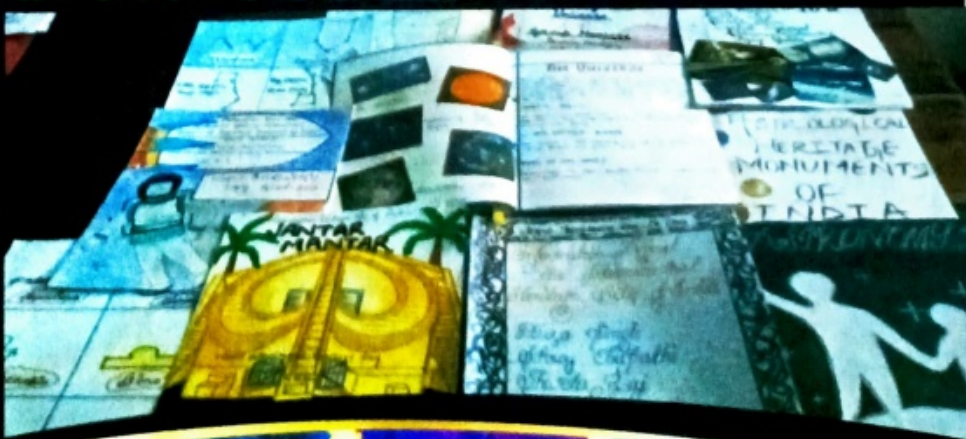
The students were very eager to participate in different events organised in school.

## Visit to a Village

On 5th June, 2017, a small group of students from J.T.C. Jubilee school visited a small village Kotwa situated 30 km from Allahabad city to observe the World Environment Day. The students were accompanied by the school Principal Mrs. I. Gupta and some teachers. The main objective of the visit was to get a genuine feedback of all environment schemes in the rural area. Prof. Sumeet Singh (G.B. Pant Institute) was our guide who shared with us about the veracity of the technological changes in farming at the root level.



The soothing breeze was replenishing to our soul and the green vistas and the strutting peacocks were a feast to behold. We were happy to find the village people aware of organic farming and new techniques of agriculture for high yield.



They had reasons to worry as well. The village pond which was once a source of irrigation and rain water harvesting had completely dried up due to illegal land occupation.

We met a young boy of 23, who had completed his diploma in Electrical Engineering and set up a rice mill which had become a source of livelihood for many.

We were happy to see the villagers using organic fertilisers for vegetables and other crops. They have started tending to power under the government schemes, cooking on LPG under the Ujjwala Scheme. Many of them were involved in poultry, running stationary shops, flour mills etc.



Overall the trip was a fruitful and memorable one for us. We realised that villages are the backbone of development and the government should take more initiatives for the upliftment of villages and from time to time people should be trained and made aware of the new schemes, issued by the government.

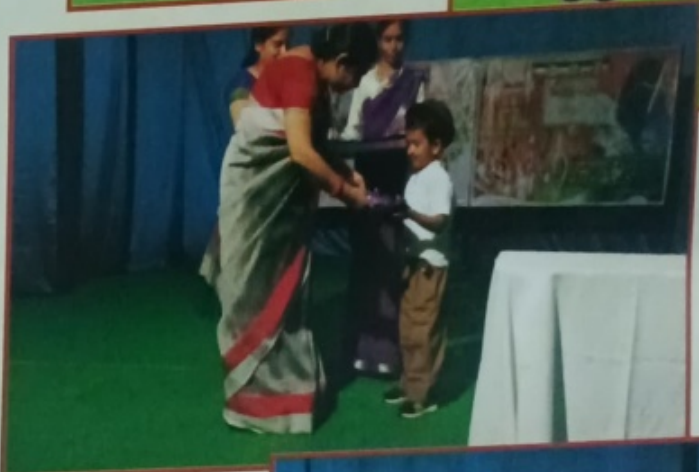

# National Education Day



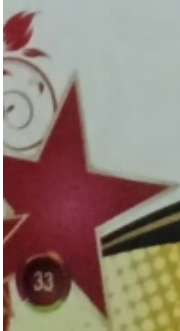

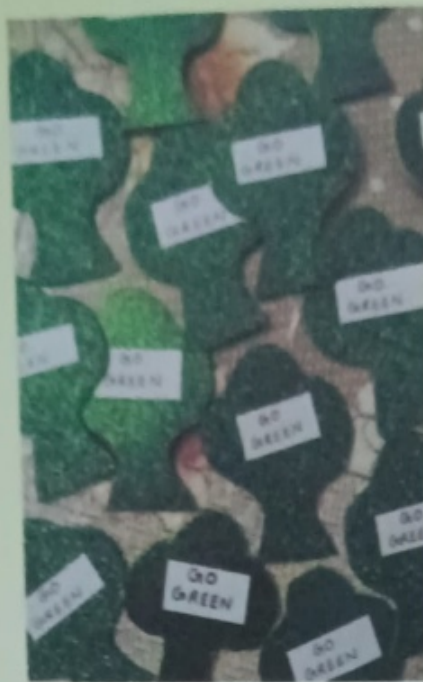


## Children's Day

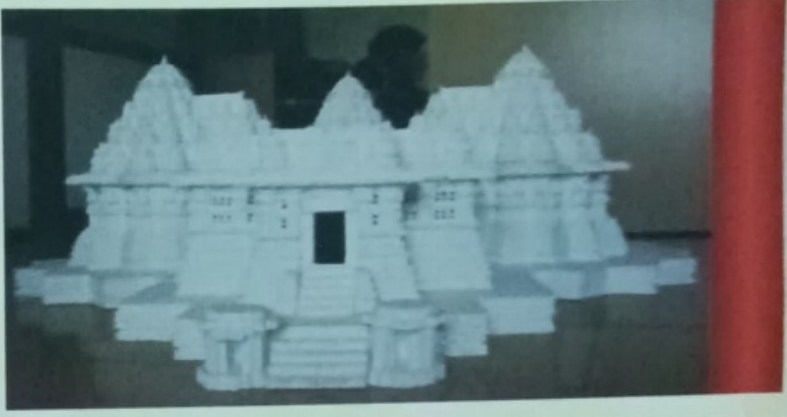

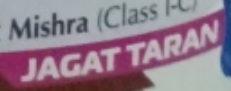

## Hardness of water

### WHAT IS WATER ?

Water is the most common fluid on Earth. It covers about 71.4% of the earth. Pure water has no colour, smell or taste. Lakes, oceans, rivers are made up of water. It may be rain (liquid) if warm or it may be frozen if cold. If it gets very cold at (0 degree celcius) it freezes and becomes ice. It is the only chemical substance on earth that exists naturally in three states. Unlike alcohol or oil when it freezes it expands only by 9%. This expansion can cause pipes to break if the water inside them freezes. However some studies suggest that by 2025, more than half of the people around the world will not have enough water.

### USES OF WATER IN OUR DAILY LIFE

Water is one of the most vital natural resources for all life on Earth. The availability and quality of water have always played an important part in determining not only where people can live but also their quality of life. Plants and animals, which are mostly inside water, need water to survive. It gives a medium for chemical reactions to take place and is the main part of blood. It keeps the body temperature same by sweating from the skin. Water helps the blood to carry nutrients from the stomach to all parts of the body to keep it active. It is the main component of drinks like milk, juice and wine.

### WHAT CAUSES HARDNESS OF WATER

The term hardness or softness are expression of the amount of Ca and Mg salts dissolved in the water. Ca and Mg salts react with the fatty acids in soap to produce a scum and if there is a high amount of Ca salt present in it it makes the water difficult for washing clothes. Some modern detergents are unaffected by Ca and Mg. The Ca and Mg salts get into the water when it shows on the surface of the Earth:
